Parent Governors - Elected by the Parents

Casey Stewart-Smith: Casey has been an elected Parent Governor since 2012 and has two children one of which is currently at Malmesbury Primary school the other has moved on to a local secondary school. Casey has lived, worked and volunteered in Tower Hamlets her whole life and is a currently a health related business owner.

Jon Griffiths: Jon joined the governing body in October 2015, has one child at Malmesbury and has lived in Tower Hamlets for 12 years, and has previously been a Governor in a local secondary school for 10 years, chairing at different times the Health and Safety Committee and the Personnel Committee.
